### Job Market Paper:

- Title: *Remote Work Wages and the Income Distribution*
- Abstract: I examine the wage gap between Remote and Traditional workers across the wage distribution using Oaxaca-Blinder decomposition and Recentered Influence Function (RIF) OLS regressions. Utilizing data from Survey of Work Attitudes and Arrangements, I find education acts as primary determinant of the wage gap. This effect increases along the wage distribution and dominates composition effects for workers at the top end of the wage distribution.
